RANGE ORIENTATION BLUE & GRAY RIFLE AND PISTOL CLUB

WE OCCUPY THIS RANGE AT THE DISCRETION OF THE TVA! We could be evicted by them without notice.

1. No alcoholic beverages of any kind are allowed on the range at anytime.
2. There is a Porta Pottie available at the range.
3. TVA requires that the yellow range gate be kept closed and locked at all times. Lock the gate after you enter and when you leave the range. The gate is left open only during scheduled shoots/matches.
4. **DO NOT DO THE FOLLOWING:**
 - A. Use glass as a target.
 - B. Shoot at a target on the ground.
 - C. Fire .50 caliber BMG rifles on the range.
 - D. No automatic weapons firing of any kind.
 - E. Shoot at the cross ties or target frame supports.
 - F. Pistols are to be fired on the Pistol Range only.
 - G. Shoot at a 200 range target from the 100 yards firing line.
 - H. Never go down range until the "All Clear" has been given.
 - I. Fire slugs only from a shotgun, no bird shot.
 - G. No jacketed rifle ammo is to be fired on the pistol range, cast lead bullets only.
6. Always shoot on the appropriate range.
7. Always make Range Safety your number 1 Priority.

8. Range Control during informal shoots:

8.a. Each person on the range is responsible for safety at all times.

8.b. Each person on the firing line is responsible for insuring that ALL individuals are safely behind the firing line before the range is declared HOT.

8.c. No vehicles are to be driven down range to change out targets.

8.d. Report all range violations by the name of the violator via e-mail if possible.

9. Range Officer designation procedures during informal shooting:

NRA Rules for Range Control state that the longest or leftmost shooter is supposed to have control of the range. Be sure that ALL shooters are aware of any move down range, and that your notification of intention to go down range is acknowledged.

1. All firearms are to be un-loaded, made safe and placed on the ground or on a bench prior to calling the range Safe to go down range.

2. NO handling of firearms when shooters are down range.

3. Give loud, clear indications of the range condition, with acknowledgments clearly received from each firing position.

SAFETY OF ALL SHOOTERS WILL BE THE PRIMARY CONSIDERATION - IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF ALL MEMBERS TO INFORM GUESTS OF THE PROPER RANGE CONTROL AND SAFETY RULES, AND TO INSURE THAT THEY ARE FOLLOWED BY ALL SHOOTERS.

GUEST ARE NOT COVERED Y THE CLUB'S LIABILITY INSURANCE!!

10. The range is closed to informal shooting during scheduled matches, Pot Shot sessions; when the grass is being mowed; and during scheduled range maintenance work days. Always check the monthly bulletin or the Clubs web page before planning on using the range on an informal basis.

11. All range rules are posted on the target shack.

12. All minor children must be accompanied by their parents/guardian at all times. All shooters must be at least 18 years old to be allowed to shoot alone.

13. The lock at the gate and on the range shack have the same combination, except the range shack behind the 100 yard berm. The combinations are changed once a year and sent to members when their membership has been renewed. Do not give this combination to any non-member, you could lose your membership. Never leave the combination so that it can be read.

14. Please remember that this is your range, and with your membership comes a good measure of responsibility for maintaining it and protecting the privilege that has been extended to us by the TVA. We have been on this range for over 40 years and would like to stay indefinitely. Please help us do that.
